In this Institution, (which is entirely separate from the Insane Hospital,) the following patients are received, viz: those that are laboring under chronic, nervous or catarrhal diseases, made or females of intemperate habits, such as are unattractive to parents or guardians; for patients of the latter description who have neglected their education, a private instructor is provided. Dr. H. is happy to state, from the success he has met with, both in his old establishment and this in respecting health and reason patients of the above descriptions, he is induced to believe that patients are restored in much less time and in greater degree, in this than in public Asylums, being well aware that the public have certain prejudices against both public and private hospitals, such as the proprietors or keepers of them being harsh, overbearing, tyrannical, and in some instances, cruel to their patients.
