NOT A DEAD POLICY.

Misconception in Europe Regarding the Monroe Doctrine.

The Course of United States in Present War Strengthens Rather Than Weakens Its Position.

The London correspondent of the New York Tribune writing under date of July 22 says: English writers on American affairs assume that the Monroe doctrine issued a challenge to England two years ago, has been abandoned or compromised by the United States government in the present conflict with Spain.

The misconception arises from confounding the Washington farewell address doctrine with the complement of it in the Monroe doctrine. The Washington principle was that Americans must remain out of European alliances and entanglements.

What English writers on American affairs fail to perceive is the irrelevance of their own interpretation of the Monroe doctrine.

"Hands off the American continent" is emphasized rather than minimized when Hawaii and the Spanish West Indies are brought directly under the influence of the United States.

GUILTY OF TREASON.

Miss Schley, Who Appealed to the Queen Regent to End the War, Committed a Serious Offense.

There is no doubt that Miss Jessie Schley, the envoy of the Paris Peace society, is guilty of treason under the laws of the United States.

"Every citizen of the United States, whether actually resident or abiding within the same, or in any country, who, without the permission of the authority of the government of the United States, directly or indirectly, commences or carries on any verbal or written correspondence or intercourse with any foreign government, or any officer or agent thereof, with an intent to influence the measures of the United States, or to defeat the measures of the government of the United States, and so forth, shall be deemed guilty of treason, the statute fixing the penalty at a fine not exceeding \$5,000 and imprisonment at from six months to three years, the same penalties applying to accessories."

Attorneys claim there is no doubt of Miss Schley's guilt under this statute, and if the government should look at her action as an interference with its rights Miss Schley's mission may end ingloriously.

INVENTS A TORPEDO AIRSHIP.

P. W. Anderson's Machine Can Kill 500,000 Men Per Hour, According to His Estimates.

An aerial torpedo war machine, self-elevating and self-propelling, capable of carrying 200 men and over 25 tons of ammunition and explosives, and with a steering apparatus capable of directing the boat in any direction against the wind, no matter how high, is the latest thing to which the attention of the government has been invited.

SEVERE TEST REQUIRED.

Shipbuilders Slow in Offering Bids for the New Torpedo Boats to Be Constructed.

Shipbuilding companies which were tumbling over each other in their desire to bid for new battleships do not display the same eagerness to secure contracts for building the new torpedo boats.

FIREPROOF WOOD.

Secretary Long has revised the plans upon which the 16 new torpedo boat destroyers are to be built as a result of the observations made by naval officers during the sea battle at Santiago. The interior finishings will be of fireproof wood, instead of oak, as originally intended.
