SUBJECT: Transfer Recommendation for GTMO Detainee, Malang Nassir,
ISN: US9AF-00355DP


1. (S) **Personal Information:** Malang Nassir is an Afghan national born in 1972 (age 30) in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Detainee has been diagnosed with latent tuberculosis but is otherwise in good health.
2. (FOUO) **Detention Information:** On 29 September 2001, subject detainee was conscripted into the Taliban and sent to Taloqan, Afghanistan. Detainee was forced to work in service-support, which for the most part consisted of driving food supplies to various Taliban locations in the area. Detainee surrendered with the Taliban forces in Konduz and was taken prisoner by the Northern Alliance. Detainee was transferred to U.S. control in January 2002, and was subsequently transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba, where he arrived on 11 June 2002. The detainee was transferred to the Guantanamo Bay detention facility because of his general knowledge of Taliban logistics and personalities. The detainee has been cooperative, but JTF GTMO considers the information obtained from and about him as not valuable or tactically exploitable.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on current information, detainee ISN: US9AF-00355 is assessed as not affiliated with al-Qaida or as being a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee folder, the knowledgeability brief (KB), and subsequent interrogations by JTF GTMO, the results of which are available on the JTF GTMO detainee database, the detainee has no further intelligence value to the United States and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detainee has not expressed thoughts of violence or made threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on the above, detainee does not pose a future threat to the U.S. or U.S. interests.
4. (S) **Recommendation:** In view of the foregoing, I recommend subject detainee be considered for release or transfer to the control of another government.
