



- Easy creation of Wikibooks
- Create electronic books in minutes*
- Popular formats including Adobe PDF files
- *Real-time creation of a Wikibook in 4 minutes (& other videos) via Phil

Why might educators use them?


- 1. Free

Why might educators use them?

- E.g. PowerPoint, Word & Wikibook




Example of Actual Use (VLE)

Providing alternative depths of support




Sample Table of Contents

Wikipedia Book Creator

- Outputs in PDF or ODF format by default
- Suitable for VLEs etc or printing for classes
- But is it really a book?
- A **book** is a set of written, printed, illustrated, or blank sheets, made of <u>ink</u>, <u>paper</u>, <u>parchment</u>, or other materials, usually fastened together to hinge at one side. A single sheet within a book is called a <u>leaf</u>, and each side of a leaf is called a <u>page</u>. A book produced in electronic form is known as an electronic book (<u>e-book</u>).
