THE TREATY.

The New York Courier and Enquirer, it is believed, was the only journal in the country that professed to be acquainted with the details of the treaty between the United States and Great Britain. Frount print the various papers in the Union have copied the terms of the negotiation. Whatever be the source whence the Courier obtained a copy of that important document, the editors seem to regard it as certainly authentic and worthy of implicit reliance. They consider the articles of negotiation published by them, perfectly genuine, and so thinking, they comment upon the terms of the treaty with unflinching severity. They look upon it as an unwarrentable and illegal concession to Great Britain. They complain of the pernicious influence of the British Government upon the negotiations, and of the secret alliance which the British Government has formed with the French and Spanish, and of the secret alliance which the French and Spanish have formed with the British Government.
