## Constitution

## Introduction

This document aims to provide a guide as to how Example Incorporated is to be set up; to define its structure, objects, powers, management and other relevant information.

## Association Structure

The association is to use an incorporated association structure.

## Objects

To provide relief from poverty and a referral service for people of the Bathurst region. Our beneficiaries are: the aged, indigenous persons, the disabled and those in poverty.

## Powers

The organisation's day-to-day management will be carried out by the association's two executives, who are also members of the committee.

The committee will make most management decisions that may have a large impact on the organisation. This committee will consist of two executives, a treasurer (or treasurers), a secretary and two ordinary members. Any decisions that all members should decide on will be handled by way of general meetings.

## Government

The association is governed by its committee, its rules and the Associations Incorporation Act 1984.

## Members

All members agree to comply with the rules determined by members and as amended from time to time.

## Non-Distribution of Funds

Members will not be distributed the association's funds. A member of the association who is employed by the association as such, is entitled to the award wage in payment for their services.

All funds are to be put towards furthering the association's objects.

## Amendments to the Constitution

Amendments to the constitution must be approved by the normal process for questions at a general meeting.

## Dissolution

Upon dissolution, the organisation will wind up operations and attempt to pay any outstanding debts. Members are limited from the liability of these debts as provided for in the rules of the association.

Any funds left after payment of debts on dissolution will be donated to the charitable organisation of the member's choice.
