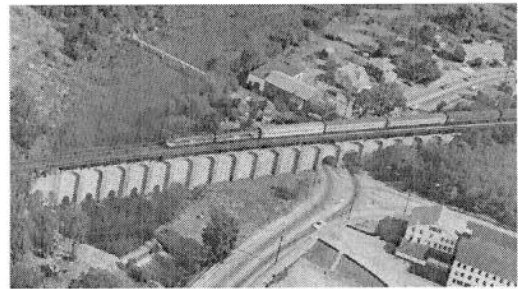

How Borderland Helped to Build the Canton Railroad Viaduct Sunday, March 29th, 1:00PM

Have you ever gone over the Canton Viaduct stone bridge on the train? Or tried to find the Moyle's Quarry in Borderland State Park? How do Borderland State Park and the Viaduct relate to each other?

Join us on Sunday, March 29th at 1:00pm at the Lawrence Newcomb Visitor Center at Borderland State Park to get the answers to these questions. Bill Hocking, Borderland State Park's Advisory Council Chairperson, will present a program on the Viaduct and the Quarry. The Canton Viaduct has been continuously used from 1834 to 2009. This hour long program will include video and lecture. A must see for anyone who has ridden over the Viaduct on a train or passed under it by foot, horse or car.
