United States Army Reserve (USAR) 1971 to 2009 Commanding General 96th Regional Readiness Command, Rank Major General. The 96th RRC, comprised of approximately 10,000 soldiers and civilians in four major subordinate commands, spread over a seven state region (Colorado, Montana, North and South Dakota, Wyoming, California and Utah), organized for mobilization and deployment as directed. Subordinate elements are comprised of 66 Units able to mobilize to fulfill wartime mission and ten maintenance / supply activities. subordinate Cooke provided BASOPS services for commands as well as for elements of 16 additional Units from other commands which are home to approximately 1,450 soldiers. The 96th RRC is comprised of more than 560 full-time personnel with 40 command centers and 13 maintenance and storage facilities with real property valued at \$251 Million and TOE/TDA equipment valued at \$224 Million. The 96th RRC has an annual operating budget of \$29.6 Million.

During his Command of the 96th RRC, MG Cooke won the Army Community of Excellence Award for the best managed command in the United States Army Reserve in 2009 and was awarded \$750,000.

From July 2001 to July 2009, MG Cooke served as Chairman of the Congressionally mandated Armed Reserve Forces Committee (ARFPC). ARFPC and its ARNG and USAR subcommittees are agencies of the Office of the Chief of Staff, US Army (OSCA) and the Secretary of the Army. Their jurisdiction is directed by regulation and further by the Secretary of the Army. ARFPC will review and comment on major policy matters directly affecting the Reserve Component (RC) of the Army. ARFPC's comments on such policy matters will accompany the final report on any such matter submitted to the Vice Chief of Staff, US Army (VCSA) and the Assistant Secretary responsible for Reserve Affairs.
