On 7 October 2009, following a DMCA takedown request by Texas Instruments, you removed pursuant to 17 U.S.C. Section 512 material from the following page concerning cryptographic signing keys provided by Texas Instruments:

I have a good faith belief that this material was removed or disabled in error as a result of mistake or misidentification of the material. I declare that this is true and accurate under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America.

For the purposes of this matter, I consent to the jurisdiction of the Federal District Court for the judicial district in which I reside (Northern District of California). I also consent to service of process by the person providing notification under Section 512(c)(1)(C) or that person's agent. However, by this letter, I do not waive any other rights, including the ability to pursue an action for the removal or disabling of access to this material, if wrongful.

Having complied with the requirements of Section 512(g)(3), I remind you that you must now replace the removed material and cease disabling access to it within fourteen business days of your receipt of this notice. Please notify me when this has been done.
