What is Wikimedia Philippines?

Wikimedia Philippines (WMPH) is a non-stock, non-profit corporation duly registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, Republic of the Philippines. The product of nearly four years of intense discussion among many prominent members of the Philippine Wikimedia community, WMPH was officially recognized as a Wikimedia chapter by the Wikimedia Foundation on March 17, 2010, becoming Asia's fourth and Southeast Asia's second recognized local chapter.

MAKING THE VISION A REALITY

Organizing a Wikimedia chapter

Wikimedia Philippines was conceived on September 13, 2006 by two Wikipedians who believed that in order for the projects of the Philippine Wikimedia community to be fully realized, a chapter was needed in order to lend a façade of legitimacy to the community's aims of empowering the Filipino people through the use of free content and, in turn, forward the aims of Wikimedia in sharing the sum of collective knowledge among the people of the world.

Although WMPH was first conceived by two people (in bold), ten Wikipedians became the first to agree in organizing a local chapter for the Philippines, six of whom are still active today in making the WMPH dream a reality.

The idea of Wikimedia Philippines in its current form came into fruition on May 20, 2007, during the First Manila Wikipedians' Meetup (Manila 1) in Mandaluyong City, Metro Manila.

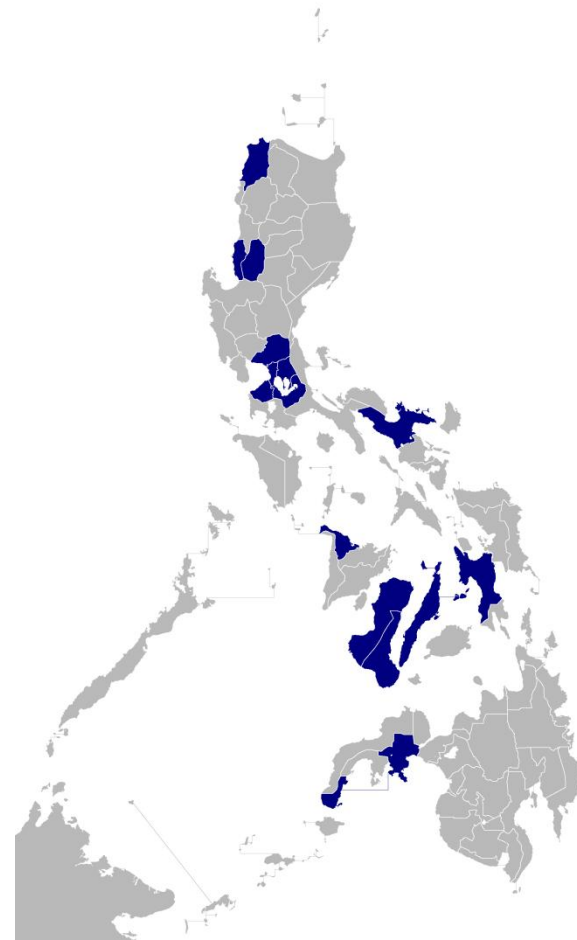

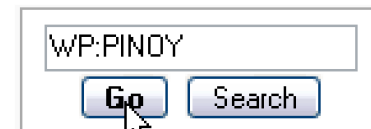

Proposed Projects and Advocacies

- Amendment of Section 176 of the Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines (section related to works of the Philippine government)
- Introduction of Wikimedia projects to the educational mainstream (originally called TTT)
- Using Philippine-language Wikimedia projects as a means of preserving and enriching local languages
- Forging of tie-ups with similar organizations, both locally and internationally
- Strengthening the position of Wikipedia as an authoritative resource by encouraging (and giving incentives to) the organic growth of articles of scholarly quality, particularly for Philippine-language projects
