## Username policy

Username policy prohibits usemames which are promotional, misleading, or oflensive

- promotional usemames:
- containing existing company, organization, group, or website names fincluding non-profit organizations)
- containing domain names or emal addresses
- misleading usemame
- close to names of celebrities, notable world figures or events, or known Wikipedians
- containing words like "bor" or "scripr" which refer to automated editing processes
- containing titles like "admin" or "sysop", which imply authority on Wikipedia

For technical reasons, a username cannot include the $\ddagger$, , and \symbols. Any underscores will be converted to spaces. The first leter of a username is automatically capitalized.
