Science Fair Display Items

On the day of the science fair, you may display certain items in front your board. Some suggestions are:

- A model of your experimental set-up
- Extra photographs, data tables or graphs
- Some of your materials used during your experiment
- Diagrams of your experimental design
- Your journal

Beware! Some items are strictly forbidden. Do NOT bring them as display items

- Human or animal food (of any type)
- Soil or waste samples
- Chemicals or liquids including water
- Sharp objects (i.e. syringes, needles, pipettes, razor blades)
- Glass objects (including picture frames and beakers)
- Flames or highly flammable materials
- Awards, medals, business cards, flags, etc
- Living organisms (including plants, animals, and microbes)
- Taxidermy of specimens or parts
- Preserved animals (including embryos)
- Human and animal parts (except for teeth, hair, nails, dried animal bones, histological sections, wet mount tissue slides)
- Poisons, drugs, controlled substances (including over-the-counter medicines)
- Dry ice or other sublimating solids
- Tanks that have contained combustible liquids or gases (unless purged with carbon dioxide)
- Batteries with open top cells
- Photographs depicting vertebrate animals in other-than-normal conditions (i.e. surgical techniques, dissection, necropsies, or other lab techniques)
