

Import requirements for fresh meat

Administration and control

The Directorate Veterinary Public Health administers the Abattoir Hygiene Act, 1992 (Act No. 121 of 1992).

The Directorate Animal Health is responsible for the administration of the Animal Diseases Act, 1984 (Act No. 35 of 1984). This Directorate controls the importation of animals and animal products. The Director: Animal Health must approve the importation of meat from a specific country in terms of acceptable risk to animal health before the Directorate Veterinary Public Health will consider the approval of establishments in that country.

Frozen and chilled meat may only be imported from establishments (abattoirs and cutting plants) approved by the Director: Veterinary Public Health in South Africa.

Veterinary authorities in countries approved by the Director: Veterinary Public Health and the Director: Animal Health inspect approved establishments routinely and notify the Directorate of Veterinary Public Health as soon as the plant no longer complies with South African requirements.

Approval of establishments

New establishments in countries approved by the Director of Veterinary Public Health are listed by the Directorate upon receiving a letter confirming the establishments' compliance with our require- ments from the Supreme Veterinary Authority in the country of origin.

Establishments in countries not exporting to South Africa must be inspected by an officer of the Directorate before the establishments will be considered for approval.



Import permit and health certificate

An importer must be in possession of a South African veterinary import permit before the product is exported from the country of origin. Veterinary import permits are issued by the Directorate Animal Health and are only issued to companies residing in South Africa.

Veterinary health certification, complying to conditions of the South African veterinary import permit, must be obtained from the veterinary authorities in the country of origin before the product is shipped.
