





The difference between vaccination and treatment

Both vaccination and treatment can be given by injection. It is therefore important to understand that vaccination is not the same as treatment, so that you can use vaccines and medicines properly to prevent and treat diseases in your animals.

- <u>Treatment cures disease</u>



Vaccination prevents disease You vaccinate healthy animals Directorate Communication


You use a vaccine to vaccinate against disease This farmer vaccinates his animals



Animals being vaccinated

The animals are protected when germs try to attack them

The other farmer does not vaccinate his animals



Directorate Communication

The animals are not Germs make the vaccinated, and are animals sick, and they therefore not protected may even die when germs attack them

Treatment

Treatment cures disease You treat sick animals You use medicine to treat disease




This farmer's animals are now sick



He runs to the state veterinary office for advice about how to treat the sick animals



The farmer and the state veterinarian treat the animals with medicine




The medicine kills the germs and the animals are healthy again

Vaccination is not treatment

- Vaccination is not the same as treatment
- If your animal has a disease and has been treated for this disease, this does not mean that the animal cannot get the disease again

If an animal is sick, vaccination will not cure the disease
