Explanation:
IMS Web sent a message to IMS/OTMA in response to selection of the Terminate button, requesting termination of the host end of an IMS Web conversation. The host end of the conversation might or might not be terminated.

User Action:
Verify that the IMS Web conversation was terminated by entering HWSCMD DISPLAY CONV on the Web server and /DISPLAY CONV on the host. If IMS Web was unable to terminate the conversation, there might be additional information in the Diagnostic Information field of the output HTML for the message.

Protocol violations can also occur when the command HWSCMD EXIT CONV is used to end a conversation while it was in progress, or due to corruption of the DAT file associated with the conversation.

Explanation:

Verify that the IMS Web conversation was terminated by entering HWSCMD DISPLAY CONV ALL on the Web server and /DISPLAY CONV BUSY on the host.

User Action:

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to find enough space to write the file representing the conversation while processing the conversation.

User Action:

Files representing conversations are written to the hwsdata subdirectory of IMS Web's installation directory. Ensure that there is adequate space in hwsdata.

Message:

HWSCnvState::updateState>Permission denied.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to access the file representing the conversation. This is most likely due to termination of the conversation by the command, HWSCMD EXIT.

User Action:

Determine the reason the conversation was terminated, then restart the conversation.

HWSCnvState::updateState>Unable to locate DAT file.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to find a file representing the conversation. The conversation was most likely terminated.

User Action:

HWSCnvState::deleteState>Can't determine DAT file to delete.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to determine the name of the file representing the conversation.

User Action:

HWSCnvState::deleteState>Can't find DAT file to delete.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to find the file representing the conversation.

HWSCnvState::isInSync>Insufficient storage.

Explanation:

Unable to obtain sufficient virtual storage.

User Action:

Reduce the storage demands on your system.

Explanation:

The IMS application program returned a request to use a message output descriptor (MOD) that is not known to IMS Web.

User Action:

If you want IMS Web to use the MOD returned in the request, you must provide it in the MFS source, and regenerate the necessary files using the IMS Web Studio tool.

HWSMFSFormat::formatOut>Output message format object (MOD) not found.

Explanation:

The IMS application program did not return a message output descriptor (MOD) and the NXT= keyword of the MID or input LPAGE did not specify the correct MOD.

User Action:

Provide the correct MOD name for the NXT= keyword of the MID or input LPAGE, or modify the IMS application program to return the correct MOD name.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to acquire sufficient virtual storage.

User Action:

Reduce the demand on the system.

Explanation:

IMS Web was unable to acquire sufficient virtual storage.

User Action:

Reduce the demand on the system.

IMS Web was unable to acquire sufficient virtual storage.

If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

You attempted to change the RUNAME option after a successful connection was established with the host.

User Action:

If you wish to change an option that is associated with the host connection, you must disconnect from the host (invoke the disconnect method), change

the option (invoke the setStringOption method), then reconnect to the host (invoke the connect method). If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

PASSWORD cannot be changed after connect.

Explanation:

You attempted to change the PASSWORD option after a successful connection was established with the host.

User Action:

If you wish to change an option that is associated with the host connection, you must disconnect from the host (invoke the disconnect method), change the option (invoke the setStringOption method), then reconnect to the host (invoke the connect method). If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

Required options not set prior to connect.

Explanation:

You attempted to invoke the connect method before setting all the required options.

User Action:

Refer to the documentation of the connect method for a list of the options that must be set before invoking the connect method. Set the missing options before invoking the connect method. If you received this message from IMS Web, contact your IBM service representative.

State of IMSClient object is invalid for invocation of connect method.

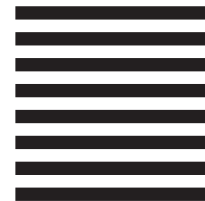
