# IBM Text Analyzer Business Component Version 1.1 Installation Guide

This installation guide contains a section with installation instructions for Text Analyzer.

The green text represents changes that were made to this document after the Text Analyzer Business Component Version 1.1 CD was created.

# **Text Analyzer installation instructions**

The IBM Text Analyzer (TA) Business Component is installed as two distinct subcomponents:

- Categorization Engine (CE)
- Training Tool (TT)

The Categorization Engine is installed and deployed as a WSBC Version 1.1 Advanced Component. The Training Tool is installed and deployed as a Java API. The Text Analyzer setup which runs from the IBM Text Analyzer Business Component Version 1.1 CD-ROM will copy all required Text Analyzer files to your WSBC Studio installation.

#### Development installation prerequisites

The following are the prerequisites for installing TA files to a development workstation from the CD-ROM.

#### Software

The Text Analyzer installation procedure has a dependency on WebSphere Business Components Studio. You must install WSBC Studio to your development workstation before you will be able to install any Text Analyzer component files to the workstation. You should follow the recommended order of installation for any software you expect to use; this will facilitate automatic setup (See the WSBC Studio installation guide).

The Text Analyzer documentation installation procedure has a dependency on the WSBC Studio documentation system. Both the WSBC Studio documentation system and the TA documentation may be installed separately from other WSBC installable components by selecting custom installation options.

#### Hardware

The Text Analyzer installation procedure does not have any hardware prerequisites for installation beyond those required by WSBC Studio. A full installation of Text Analyzer, including documentation, requires 73539Kb of available hard drive space.

#### Development deployment prerequisites

The Text Analyzer AC environment must provide the Java API for XML Parsing Version 1.0.1 (At the time of this writing this version is being replaced by Java API for XML Processing Version 1.1). This is available by downloading it as set of Java packages from the Sun Java Web site and is deployed as the jaxp.jar and parser.jar files. This API is used to access the XML4J XML Parser which is deployed as part of WebSphere Application Server.

## Production deployment prerequisites

The Text Analyzer AC has a runtime dependency on IBM XML4J XML Parser for Java and the Java API for XML Parsing.

If you have WebSphere Application Server installed in your production environment, then you already have the required xml4j.jar file. You may obtain the parser separately from the IBM alphaWorks Web site. When deploying the Categorization Engine or Training Tool you may also need to deploy XML4J by copying the .jar file to the deployment environment, specifying the path to the XML4J .jar file or both. See "Development deployment prerequisites" for the details of how to obtain and deploy the Java API for XML Parsing.

## Install Text Analyzer files to a development workstation

Text Analyzer files are installed to a Windows NT development workstation by running the setup program from the IBM Text Analyzer Business Component CD-ROM. This file is located in the TAInstall folder and is named Setup.exe.

Run the Setup.exe file to start the Text Analyzer installer and follow the prompts. You will be warned if you have not installed WebSphere Application Server and Java API for XML Parsing (JAXP); you may continue with the installation and install these items at a later date.

You must accept the International Program License Agreement to start the installation.

Select the installation components you wish to install. Choose **Typical** to install both the Text Analyzer files and the Text Analyzer documentation. Choose **Custom** to select individual installation components (uncheck the components that should not be installed.)

If you selected installation of the Text Analyzer component itself, then the Text Analyzer files will be copied to a TextAnalyzer folder within your WSBC Studio installation. If you selected to install the Text Analyzer documentation, the WSBC online help system will be updated; you will find the Text Analyzer documentation as an item under the Topics heading in the table of contents.

A Text Analyzer folder is created at *<Your WSBC Install directory*>\1.1\ACFeatures\Components\TextAnalyzer\. All Text Analyzer files for both the Text Analyzer AC (Categorization Engine) and the Training Tool are located here. You will need to copy various files from this location when developing a TA client, developing a customized TT, and when installing and deploying the CE and TT to a production environment.

# Installed files

The following tables describe the Text Analyzer files and their locations after installation. The default installation folder C:\Program Files\IBM\WSBC\1.1\ACFeatures\Components\ contains the TextAnalyzer folder; all Text Analyzer files are located within this folder. The xml4j.jar (XML4J) and parser.jar (JAXP) files are required to complete an installation as described in the prerequisite sections.

#### Install the TT Java packages to a VisualAge for Java workspace

- 1. Create a VAJ project in your workspace for the TA objects.
- 2. Import all .class and resource files from the TABase.jar file into your selected project.

#### Install the TA AC (CE) Java packages to a VisualAge for Java workspace

- 1. Click on the EJB tab in the VAJ workbench.
- 2. Create an EJB group if required. Right-click on the Enterprise Bean pane to open the context menu and select **Add** from the menu and then select **EJB Group** from the submenu.
- 3. Right-click on the EJB group to open the context menu and select **Import Enterprise Bean...** to open a dialog box.
- 4. Browse to the TextAnalyzerAC.jar . Ensure that all Beans, classes, and resources are selected with check marks.
- 5. Click **Finish** to load the AC.
- 6. Ensure that the CommandTarget Session Bean is available from the AC Services package located in an EJB group. If it is not installed, install it from CommandTargetEJB.jar.

#### Deploy the TT API in a development environment.

Install the following files to your Training Tool test environment:

- TextAnalyzerBase.jar
- eflnl27w.dll
- POEJNI.dll
- Language dictionaries as required (\*.dic and \*.abr files)

Refer to the online documentation for details on how to deploy and configure the V1R1 Training Tool reference GUI.

## Deploy the TA AC EJB in the VAJ WebSphere test environment

- 1. Open the workspace EJB Group context menu with a right-click. Select **Generate Deployed Code** from the menu to generate the EJB code.
- 2. Again, open the workspace EJB Group context menu with a right-click. Select **Add** from the menu and then select **Server Configuration** from the submenu.
- Start the WebSphere Test Environment from Tools > WebSphere Test Environment and in the left pane select Servlet Engine. In the right pane click on Edit Class Path, click the Select all button and click OK. Click the Start Servlet Engine button.
- 4. Start the Persistent Name Server by selecting the **Persistent Name object** and then in the right pane selecting **Start name server**. Check the console and wait for the "Server open for business" message.
- 5. Start the EJB Server. From the Workbench select the EJB tab, right-click in the Enterprise Bean pane, and select **Open to** > Server Configuration. You should see the ACCommand and TextAnalyzer servers. Right-click on each server and select Start; wait for the "Server open for e-business" message to appear in the console window.

## Deploy the TT Java packages in a production environment.

Install the following files to your Training Tool production environment:

- TextAnalyzerBase.jar
- eflnl27w.dll
- POEJNI.dll
- Language dictionaries as required (\*.dic and \*.abr files)

# Install a deployable TA AC EJB on a production WebSphere Application Server

Install the following files to your production environment.

- TextAnalyzerBase.jar
- TextAnalyzerAC.jar
- TextAnalyzerACEJBDeployed.jar
- XML4J.jar
- efln27w.dll
- POEJNI.dll
- Language dictionaries as required (\*.dic and \*.abr files)

#### Deploy a TA AC instance using a production WebSphere Application Server

Before deploying Text Analyzer you should deploy AC services. (See "Deploy Advanced Component Services on WebSphere Application Server" in the WSBC Studio Installation Guide.)

#### Configure WebSphere Application Server to deploy Text Analyzer AC instances

Before proceeding, ensure that the WebSphere Application Server is configured for use with WSBC ACs. The ACServicesEJB.jar file should be in the WebSphere Application Server admin classpath. (The TextAnalyzer AC is deployed as an Enterprise Java Bean (EJB)).

- 1. Start the WebSphere Application Server AdminServer service.
- 2. Open the WebSphere Administrator's Console.
- 3. Select the topology view of and navigate to and select the server on which you want to deploy the Text Analyzer AC. A pane will appear on the right side.
- 4. Enter the following command line arguments into the Command line argument text field on the general tab of the configuration.

-mx128m -classpath <*your full path*>/TextAnalyzerBase.jar; <*your full path*>/TextAnalyzerAC.jar;

Be sure to specify the full file system paths for the .jar files in the classpath argument and to separate the entries with a semicolon. The memory allocation option may be adjusted as required to suit your needs.

#### Deploy an instance of the Text Analyzer AC using WebSphere Application Server

- 1. Start WebSphere Application Server service.
- 2. Start the WebSphere Application Server Administrator's Console.
- 3. Select the topology view.
- 4. Navigate down the server tree down to your EJB container.
- 5. Open the Create EJB dialog with a right-click on the container to open the context menu, select **Create** from the menu, and finally select **Enterprise Bean** from the submenu.
- 6. Click on the **Browse** button and navigate to the location of the TextAnalyzerACEJB.jar file and select the file to view the EJBs it contains.
- Select the com.ibm.wsbc.ac.textAnalyzerInterface/TextAnalyzerInterface.ser EJB. If you are prompted to enable work load management, select No. (The navigator closes and you are returned to the Create EJB dialog which now has fields filled in.)
- 8. Ensure that the EJB has a unique JNDI HomeName within the container. Click Edit on the Create EJB dialog to open the Deployment Properties dialog. Edit the JNDI HomeName field; the default name is the fully qualified package name followed by the Session Bean identifier followed by the instance name (com/ibm/wsbc/ac/textanalyzer/TextAnalyzerInterface). Any name may be used provided that it is unique. Click OK to close the Deployment Properties Dialog.
- 9. Click **Create** and navigate to the location of the TextAnalyzerACEJBDeployed.jar. Select the file to create the Text Analyzer AC instance. Click **OK** to close the Create EJB dialog.
- 10. Run the AC Deployer Tool to perform the JNDI registration.
