Purpose

Some customer asked for the capability to go to the TSO from WSED and execute ISPF commands, like interactive CLISTS.

Although WebSphere $^{\text{\tiny{\$}}}$ Developer for zSeries $^{\text{\tiny{\$}}}$ (WD/z) does not provide a TN3270 screen, the basic Java $^{^{\text{\tiny{TM}}}}$ classes are available, but not accessable by the user.

This paper describes an available plug-in that when installed can provide a 3270 (TN3270) screen in the WD/z workbench.

Installing and configuring the Host Connect plugin

1. Installation of the required WD/z plug-in:

The Host Connect plugin has an installshield wizard. This pops up after clicking on the install .exe file (HostConnectTP.exe) or the setup.exe icon. Follow this wizard, accept the license, and finish the install.

At this point the installation is complete. The next time that WD/z is started this plug-in is linked into the desktop.

Note: If after restarting WD/z the plug-in does not show up in the File -> New -> Other... menu then you will need to restart the WD/z desktop with the '-clean' option. To do that - go to Windows® Start -> Run and type in <install directory> \IBM\Rational\SDP\6.0\rationalsdp.exe -clean and click on OK

For example:

2. Setup for each desktop

Create a simple project to contain the 3270 terminal sessions

- a. Create a Simple projectFile -> New -> Other... -> Simple -> Project
- b. Enter the Service project name, like HostConnect and click Finish.




Figure 2. Create a simple project

3. Create a 3270 session

The next step is to add a 3270 connection to the simple project If the plug-in does not show up in the menu list, then close down WD/z and restart it with the '- clean option'. See the notes in the install section on -clean.

• 3.1. Create a 3270 connection window:

File -> New -> Other... -> Sample Host Connection Wizards -> Host Connect Editor file

Note: You may have to select show all wizards to see the Sample Host Connection Wizard Click Next

Enter the container name, like HostConnect (Optionally use the browse button to select the project you just created).

Optionally change new_file.hce to a new file name. For example: CTFMVS07.hce

Note: The extension must be .hce

Enter the Host name or IP address to the host that you want to connect to. For example: crfmvs07.rtp.raleigh.ibm.com

If you don't do this now you can change it later.

Optionally you can change the screen size, session type, Host port number or code page.

Click on Connect. (Once Connected, if you want to Disconnect then click on the Disconnect button) Click Finish




Figure 3. Create 3270 session

Note: To create another 3270 session, to say another ID or system, repeat step 3 and give the file name a different name. For example

CTFMVS08.hce

4. Connecting to a host system

To connect to the host TSO to interact with ISPF, or execute CLIST or other 3270 applications complete the following:

a. 4.1. Open the z/OS® projects perspective and double click on 3270.terminal your created earlier.




Figure 4. Click on a Project

b. 4.2. Select the Host Properties tab




Figure 5. Host connection properties

If the properties were set up during the create session stage (described earlier) no additional steps are required to define the session. If you need to add or change session information then continue. Enter or change the Host name or IP address to the host that you want to connect to. For example: crfmvs07.rtp.raleigh.ibm.com

Optionally you can change the screen size, session type, Host port number or code page.

Click on Connect. The status message will update with the current connect status. You will automatically jump to the Host Connection tab to login and interact with the host.

Once connected, if you want to Disconnect then select the Host Properties tab and click on the Disconnect button. A confirmation dialog will appear and after selecting Yes the session will disconnect.

c. 4.3. At this point you should be connected and the screen switched to the Host Connection tab




Figure 7. 3270 Session

You can now logon as necessary. To get a full screen double click on the editor tab.




Figure 8. Full screen ISPF panel
