





 - Microsoft Windows Vista operating system support (Lotus Notes 8 release)
 - Microsoft Windows 32-bit (IBM Lotus Domino[®] 8 Release) and 64-bit support (planned for IBM Lotus Domino[®] 8.01 Release)
- Microsoft Office integration
 - IBM Lotus Editors read/write Microsoft Office files (2000-2003)
 - Microsoft Word as alternate mail editor
 - Lotus Notes mail from Microsoft Office document
 - Microsoft Office Document Library template
- Integrated Lotus Quickr document management
 - Via Lotus Sametime plug-in





Lotus. Sametime

Unified communications and collaboration (IBM UC^{2™}) services



- Live name support in Microsoft Office
 - Recognizes names and offers chat/calling options via Smart Tags
 - Adds support for Lotus Notes e-mail/calendaring (if installed)
- Live name and Web conferencing integration in Microsoft Outlook
 - Adds awareness to names in inbox, messages, calendar
 - Initiate chats, VoIP, video, lookup directory information in context of work
 - Automatically schedule Lotus Sametime Web conferences from Microsoft Outlook calendar





Collaborative content and team services



- Complete Microsoft Windows Explorer integration
 - Drag and drop, Copy and paste, etc.
 - Network drive features with doc management capabilities
 - Integrated Action Menu
- Works with Backup/synchronization tools (e.g. SyncToy)

Office Integration


- Menu integration
 - Save/Open from library or teamworkspace
 - Create from Document Type
- Adds:
 - Check in/check out,
 - Workflow approval
 - Version control
- Supports Microsoft Office XP, 2003, 2007








Microsoft Office connector





Microsoft Windows Explorer connector






Lotus Quickr connector for Microsoft Outlook




Microsoft Outlook 2007 Integration – Atom Feeds









