How Edin greatly reduced query time for a global investment banking firm

Edin loves to break things that initially seem to be unbreakable. Edin was an ideal fit for the challenge of reducing the standard query time in a data warehouse application at an investment banking firm from 32 seconds to less than three seconds, a 91% reduction in query time. Out of the gate he brought the query time down to 21 seconds, and then 13 before hitting a roadblock. Edin leveraged the best data query experts from the Lab, and together they were able to get the query time below three seconds. It was a fantastic accomplishment, accelerating the customer's access to information.
