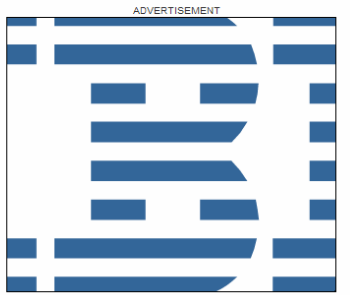

IBM CICS legacy at the heart of SOA

As I mentioned in a recent article IBM is to make a series of software announcements that will bring z/series to the heart of SOA (service oriented architecture). The first announcement included CICS Transaction Server V3.1 and CICS Transaction Gateway V6.0. They include several significant enhancements that show that IBM intends that CICS will not just be a passive legacy system but will be driving new applications and users into the web services world.

The previous release of CICS TS had support for SOAP but only as a service provider. This means that new web services applications could request services from existing CICS applications; this wrapping of CICS gave the impression that IBM expected all new applications to be non-CICS web services solutions and that the CICS applications would, over time, be phased out and replaced by modern solutions.

IBM Solidifies SOA Stance

IBM (Quote, Chart) made two significant moves to improve its service-oriented architecture (SOA) (define) portfolio.

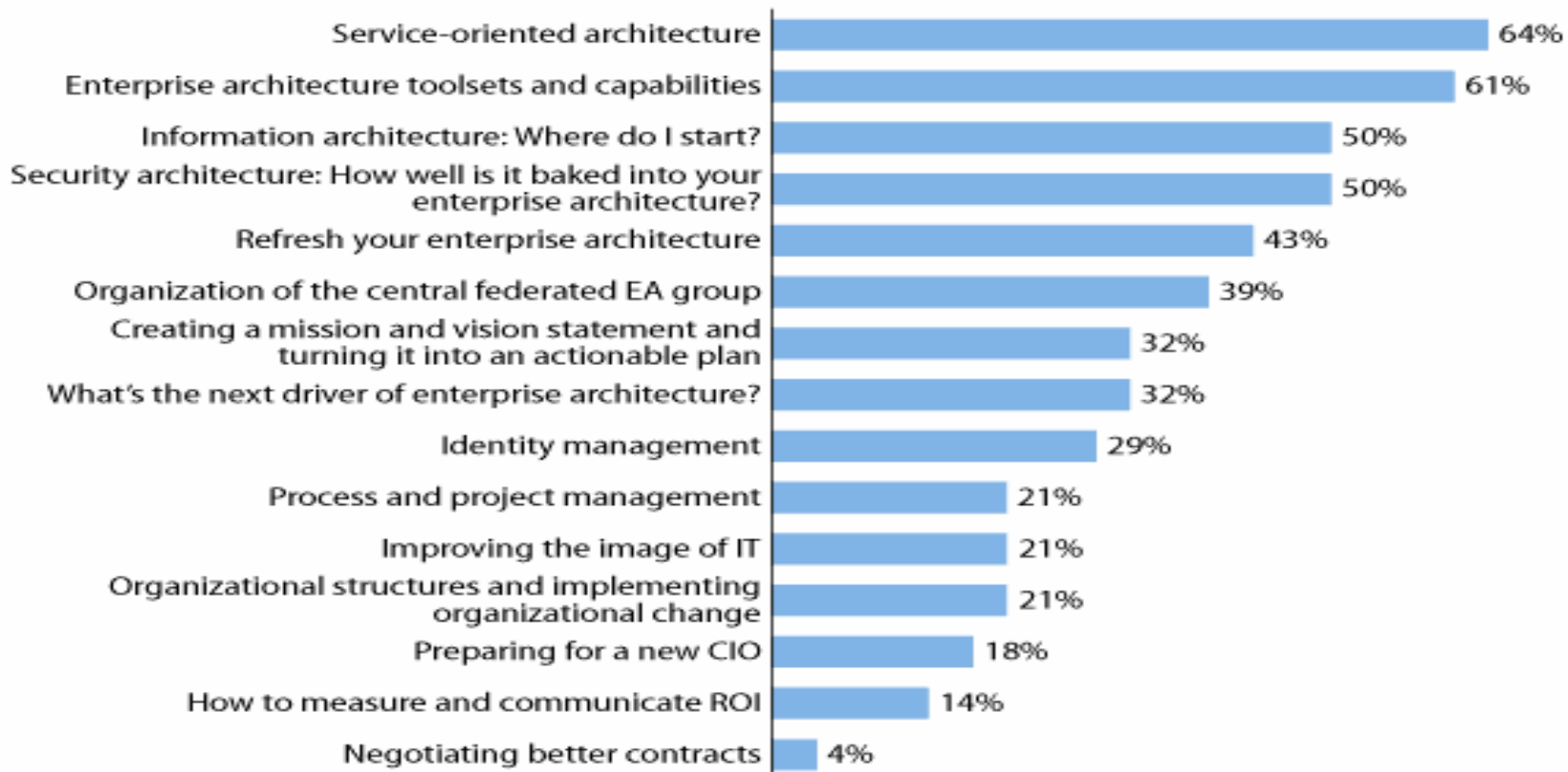
IBM's Software Group has purchased an enterprise license of LogicLibrary's Logidex to help catalog and manage the reusability of software assets, such as Web services (define), legacy applications components, XML schema and frameworks.

Logidex will complement IBM's Rational ClearCase and IBM Rational Application Developer change and configuration management software, according to LogicLibrary CEO Greg Cotichia. IBM will use Rational and Logidex to ease business processes integration for customers.

While the Rational line also boasts reusability to cut down on the amount of code programmers have to write, Cotichia said IBM picked Logidex for features not found in the Rational line. The Logidex SDA Library lists assets and their relationships to each other, including technical infrastructure, legacy and business

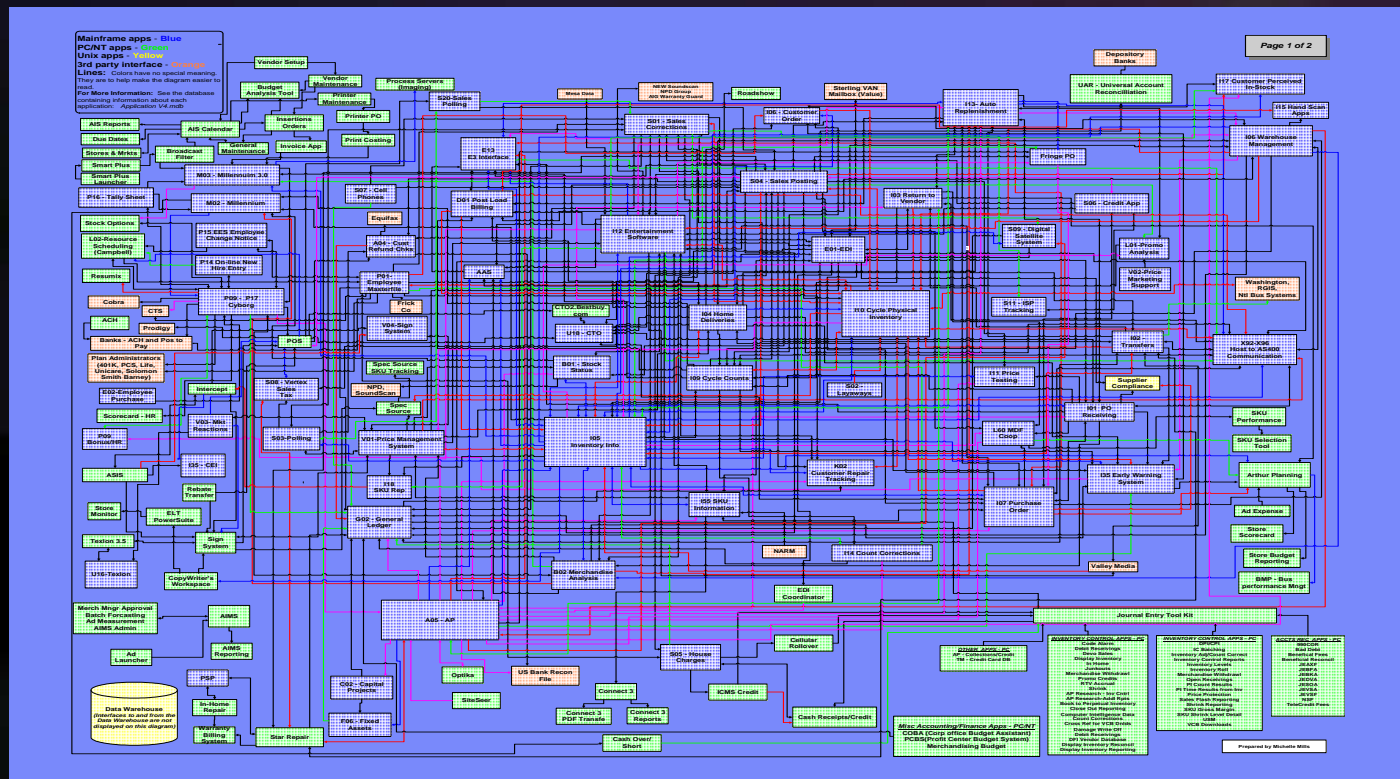
The question: IT change or business change?

Industries need standards now

Automotive

- Quality issues—warranty costs average US\$700 per vehicle in the U.S.
- Growing need for multivendor in-vehicle systems/software integration

Healthcare

- Accelerating costs, slow response times, quality of patient records
- Increasing pressure to integrate payers, providers, hospitals

Electronics

- Moving from traditional manufacturing to configure-to-order
- Lack ability to mass produce with last-minute customization

Banking

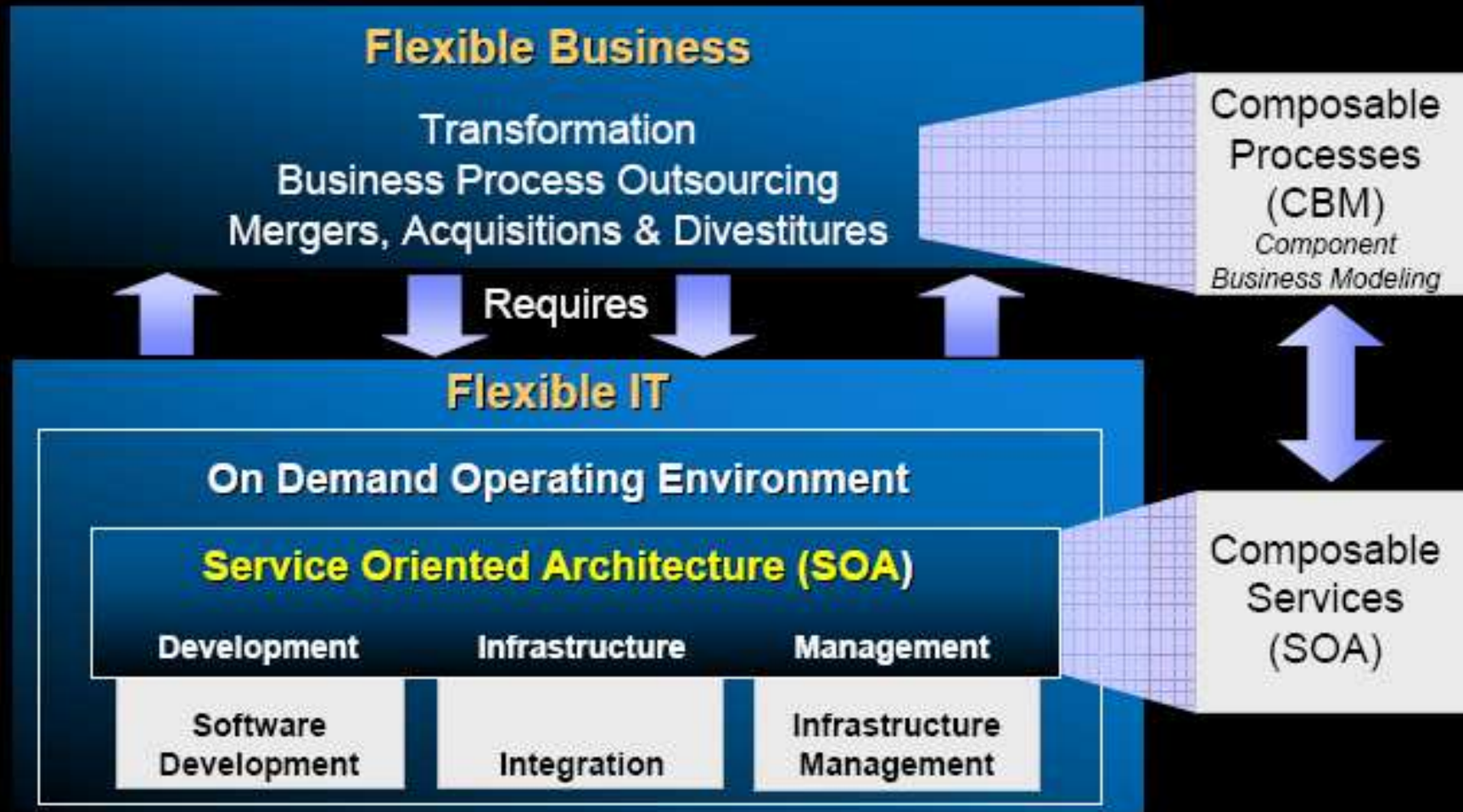
