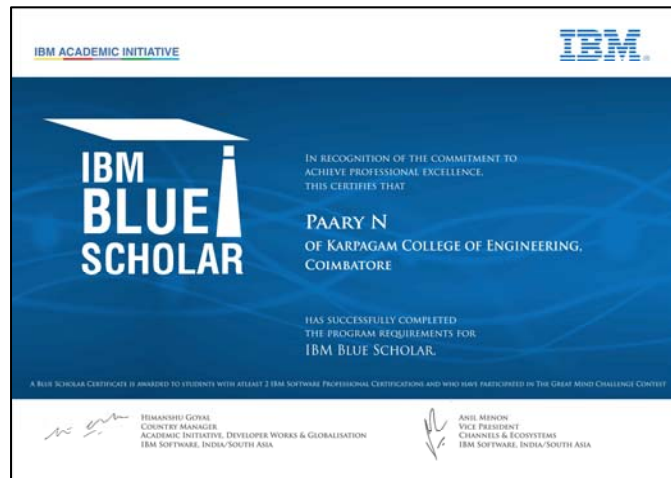
The criteria to be eligible for this is:

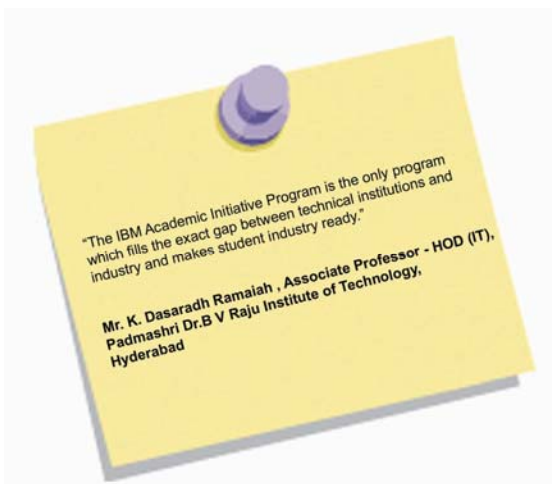
