Product overview

IBM® Business Process Manager (IBM BPM) Pattern is a virtual pattern configuration of IBM BPM that provides business process management capabilities that are configured for typical business process management projects.

A *virtual pattern* is a system-centric or application-centric pattern that you build to define the resources that are required to support software, including web applications, databases, and user registries. To build a virtual pattern, you use pattern artifacts, such as software components, script packages, links, and policies, and you specify quality-of-service levels. You then use the virtual pattern to create, deploy, and manage IBM BPM environments.

IBM Process Federation Server Pattern is an optional component for IBM BPM. You install this component to create a federated process environment that provides business users with a single point of access to their task list and launch list.

1 Step 1: Access the software and documentation



After you download the IBM Business Process Manager Pattern package from IBM Passport Advantage[®], go to Patterns for IBM Business Process Management (http://www.ibm.com/support/docview.wss?uid=swg27036093), and under **Patterns for IBM Business Process Management**, follow the instructions for the appropriate version and operating system.
