Product overview

IBM® Business Process Manager is a and easy to use business process management platform that helps you visibly manage your business processes. It includes tools and runtime environments that help process owners and business users design, run, monitor, and optimize processes, enabling them to directly improve their business processes.

1 Step 1: Access your software and documentation

- IBM WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment V7.0 supplements (including IBM Update Installer for WebSphere Software, IBM HTTP Server, web server plug-ins, and application clients for WebSphere Application Server.)
- IBM DB2 Enterprise Server Edition V9.7
- IBM Tivoli® Directory Server V6.3
- IBM Rational® Application Developer V7.5

2 Step 2: Evaluate your hardware and system configuration



You can use IBM BPM in many different configurations. See *Planning for IBM Business Process Manager* in the information center for details. Review the product license to ensure that you have the necessary authorizations to support your topology and that you understand the usage restrictions for all software components included with the product.

3 Step 3: Install IBM BPM



These instructions briefly tell you how to perform a typical installation of your product using the minimal number of clicks.

To create either a stand-alone Process Center server or Process Server profile using the DB2 Express database:

1. Start the launchpad file from your DVD media or from where you extracted the electronic image. From the launchpad, select **Install using typical installer**.
2. Select whether to **Install Process Center** or **Install Process Server**, and then click **Next**.
3. Verify the information on the next panel including the location for the installation and click **Next**.
4. Choose to install an embedded DB2 Express database.

Tip: If you already have DB2 installed you are prompted to use an existing database. You may also use the existing database to install the product using another database type.

Click **Next**.

5. Read and accept the license agreement, and then click **Install Software** to begin your installation.
6. While the software is installing, you can view and print information about the installation. The progress displays at the bottom of the panel.
7. When the installation has completed, launch the First Steps console.

For complex installations choose **Install using custom installer** on the launchpad. IBM Installation Manager launches. For detailed installation instructions, see *installing and configuring IBM Business Process Manager Advanced* in the information center.
