Product overview

IBM® Business Process Manager (BPM) is a comprehensive and easy-to-use business process management platform that helps you visibly manage your business processes. It includes tools and runtime environments that help process owners and business users design, run, monitor, and optimize processes to directly improve their business processes.

1 Step 1: Access your software and documentation

- IBM Rational® Application Developer for WebSphere Software V8.0.3

2 Step 2: Evaluate your hardware and system configuration

Review the product license to ensure that you have the necessary authorizations to support your topology and that you understand the usage restrictions for all software components that are included with the product.

3 Step 3: Install IBM Business Process Manager Advanced



To create either a stand-alone IBM Process Center server or IBM Process Server profile using the DB2 Express database, complete the following steps for a typical installation:

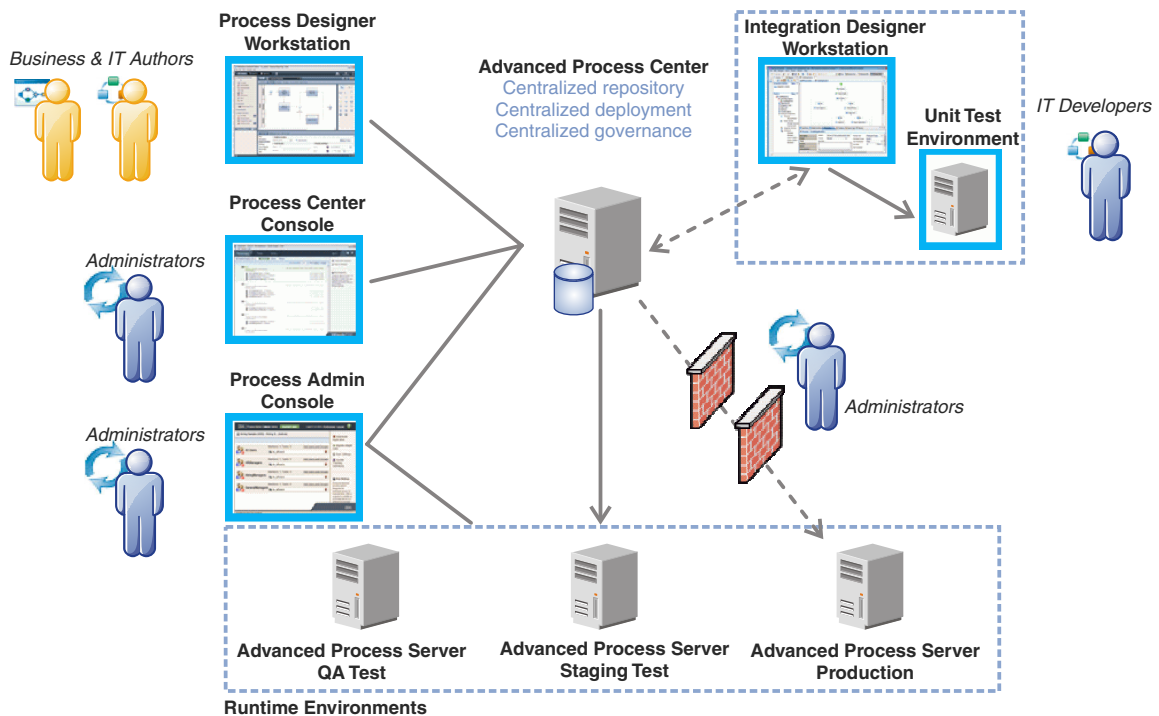
1. Start the launchpad file from your DVD media or from where you extracted the electronic image. From the launchpad, select **using the typical installer**.
2. Select **Install Process Center** or **Install Process Server**, and then click **Next**.
3. Verify the information on the next panel including the location for the installation and click **Next**.
4. Choose to install an embedded DB2 Express database. If you already have DB2 installed, you are prompted to install the product using the existing database. Click **Next**.
5. Read and accept the license agreement, and then click **Install Software** to begin your installation. While the software is installing, you can view and print information about the installation.
6. When the installation has completed, open the First Steps console.

For custom installations, select **using the custom installer** on the launchpad. IBM Installation Manager starts.

The following illustration shows the IBM BPM Advanced components that are installed across multiple systems in a common topology, known as a network deployment configuration.

At the center is the Advanced Process Center, where all the development activities occur. The authoring tools, the administrative consoles, and the Advanced Process Servers for testing, staging, and production are connected to the Advanced Process Center.
