Product overview

IBM® Business Process Manager (BPM) Express is a comprehensive process management platform that helps you manage your business processes. It includes tools and runtime environments that help you run, monitor, and optimize your business processes.

1 Step 1: Access the software and documentation

2 Step 2: Evaluate the hardware and system configuration



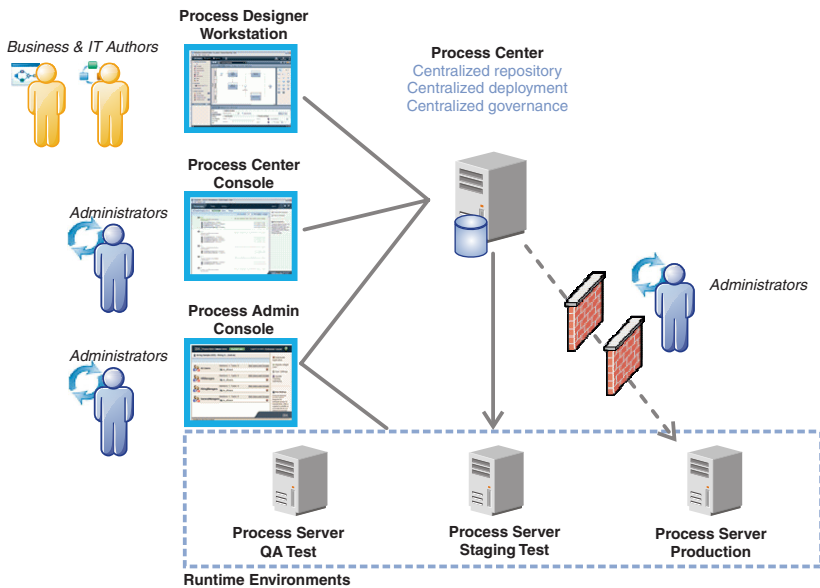
You can use IBM BPM in many different configurations. 3 Step 3: Review the installation architecture

The following illustration shows the IBM BPM Express components installed on the same system in a common topology, known as a stand-alone configuration.

At the center is IBM Process Center, where all the development activities occur. The authoring tools, the administrative consoles, and the process servers for development, test, staging, and production are connected to Process Center.

4 Step 4: Install IBM Business Process Manager Express



To create a stand-alone topology by using the DB2 Express Edition database, complete the following steps for a typical installation:

1. Obtain the compressed files from the DVDs or from the downloaded images, and then extract all the files from the compressed files to the same location on your hard disk. You might be prompted to overwrite directories.
2. Start the launchpad file and, from the launchpad, select **using the typical installer**.
3. Select **Install Process Center** or **Install Process Server**, and then click **Next**.
4. Verify the information on the next panel, including the location for the installation, and click **Next**.
5. Install an embedded DB2 Express Edition database. If you already have DB2 installed, you are prompted to install the product using the existing database. Click **Next**.
6. Read and accept the license agreement, and then click **Install Software** to begin your installation. While the software is being installed, you can view and print information about the installation.

When the installation is complete, the Quick Start console starts automatically.
