Quick Start Guide

This guide is intended to get you started with IBM WebSphere Message Broker Version 6.1.

Product Overview

WebSphere[®] Message Broker is a powerful information broker that allows both business data and information, in the form of messages, to flow between disparate applications, and across multiple hardware and software platforms. Business rules can be applied to the data that is flowing through the message broker in order to route, store, retrieve, and transform the information. Rules are defined within the integrated graphical user interface to control storage, transformation, and enrichment of messages flowing through the broker.



Step 1: Access your software

If you download your product from IBM[®] Passport Advantage[®], refer to the Passport Advantage information for download instructions.

This product offering includes:

- A Quick Start CD, which includes the WebSphere Message Broker information center, and PDF copies of the Installation Guide in English and other languages
- A printed Installation Guide in US English
- For each supported operating system, a set of CDs that contain the code for runtime components and other required products
- For both Linux[®] (x86 platform) and Windows[®], a set of CDs that contain the WebSphere Message Broker Toolkit code
- A DVD that contains all the required code for Linux (x86 platform)
- A DVD that contains all the required code for Windows

2 Step 2: Evaluate your hardware and system configuration

To find details of the hardware and software configurations required for installation of WebSphere Message Broker, refer to the Installation Guide provided in this package. Information is given for each of the environments in which you can install the product.

Step 3: Access your documentation


A printed copy of the Installation Guide in US English is provided in this package. It is also available in PDF format on the Quick Start CD, in both US English and other national languages. The CD also contains the complete information center, which you can view directly from the CD, or install onto a workstation (instructions are provided on the CD).

4 Step 4: Review the base architecture

The diagram below shows the basic architecture of a WebSphere Message Broker configuration. For a detailed explanation of how the various components of the product work, run the animated Quick Tour that is provided in the information center.



Step 5: Install your system

Before starting to install the product, first separate those items in the package (CDs or DVD) that are relevant to the environment into which you are installing WebSphere Message Broker. Then follow the detailed step-by-step installation instructions provided in the Installation Guide, specific to your environment. Note that the Toolkit can be installed only onto a Windows or a Linux (x86 platform) operating system.
