

## **Chapter 1. Introduction**

### About this document

This document can help you install the **Cldc1.1** and **Midp2.0** configuration that you need to run a J9 VM executable on your Palm OS mobile device.

**Note:** This document assumes a certain level of knowledge about working with Palm OS mobile devices. For example, if you need further information on how to install files on your device, please refer to the Palm OS documentation.

### **About J9 runtimes**

#### What is a J9 runtime?

A complete J9 runtime consists of:

• A J9 virtual machine executable

This is a Java<sup>TM</sup> 2 Micro Edition (J2ME<sup>TM</sup>) application that is built to run on a "virtual machine" (VM) without regard to the processor or operating system of the device it is running on. By isolating the software from these considerations, it is perfectly suited to meet the unique needs of devices with an embedded environment.

• A collection of shared library files

For each supported platform and device, an appropriate runtime environment must be created to allow the J9 application to run. Which library files must be included in your runtime environment is determined by:

- Which processor your device uses
- Which class library configuration(s) your operating system requires
- Whether the runtime environment is created with command line tools or the workbench

### About J9 class libraries

#### Which J9 class libraries are available for a Palm OS device?

The following J9 class libraries are available for your Palm device:

- jclCldc1.1 for Palm 0S is an implementation of the J2ME Connected Limited Device Configuration 1.1 (JSR-46), based on the Connected Limited Device Configuration 1.0 (JSR-030).
- jclMidp2.0 for Palm is an implementation of the *J2ME Mobile Information Device Profile 2.0* (JSR-118), based on the *Midp 1.0* specification (JSR-37).

### **About PRC packages**

#### What is a PRC package?

The PRC package is a collection of files packaged together to apply to the Palm OS devices.

## **Chapter 2. Tasks**

This chapter provides tasks for installing and removing Palm OS 5 runtime components.

### Installing Palm OS 5 runtime components

In order to begin using IBM WebSphere Everplace Micro Environment, you must first install the correct runtime components on your Palm OS 5 handheld or Palm OS 5 Simulator. The runtime components consist of PRC files, which can be found in the prc\ARM and prc\IA32 directories of this distribution. For Palm OS 5devices, use the PRC files in the prc\ARM directory. For Simulator, use the PRC files in the prc\IA32 directory.

The files for use on devices are:

• J9JavaVmmidp20.prc

The installer for the VM itself and other required components. This is required to be installed in order to run Java applications.

J9pref.prc

The developer preferences panel. This must be installed in order to debug Java applications.

For instructions on how to install PRC files, see the documentation that came with your handheld or Simulator.

Once installed, you will see one additional application in your Launcher, MIDlet HQ. This application is the Java application management system (AMS). An additional option, IBM Java VM, will also appear in the Preferences area. You can further confirm that the installation was successful by selecting Info from the Launcher's drop-down menu. The names of the application components are:

- Palm database name
- IBM Java VM
- J9 Exchanger
- J9 Java Launcher
- J9 Java VM
- J9 MIDP Bundle
- MIDlet HQ

The next step is to install a Java application that has been packaged as a PRC file. Note that only applications that have been specifically packaged for this version of WebSphere Micro Environment will work correctly. You will find sample applications that have been correctly packaged in the samples directory of this distribution.

**Note:** J9JavaVMMidp20.prc is an installer application that assembles the required components from a single PRC file. Limitations in Palm HotSync prevent code segment sizes greater than 64 kB from being synchronized on or off the device. Due to this limitation the runtime components are not backed up. If you must hard reset your device, the J9JavaVMMidp20.prc must be manually reinstalled.

### Installing on Palm OS 5 Simulator

On the simulator you must install all PRCs in the prc/IA32 directory. You will also need to copy \prc\IA32\J9JavaVMMidp20.dll to the Simulator directory (i.e., where PalmSim.exe resides) in order for the runtime to work correctly. Otherwise, you will receive an error message stating that the file could not load.

## **Removing Palm OS 5 runtime components**

Prior to removing the runtime, make sure any MIDlets downloaded over the air ("OTA")with MIDlet HQ have been deleted from the device. If MIDlets are still present in theMIDlet HQ, they cannot be removed after the runtime has been deleted. From the Palm OS launcher, select **App>Delete...** and delete the following runtime components:.

- Palm database name
- IBM Java VM
- J9 Exchanger
- J9 Java Launcher
- J9 Java VM
- J9 MIDP Bundle
- MIDlet HQ

For detailed instructions on how to remove applications, see the documentation that came with your handheld or Simulator.

## Chapter 3. J9 command options

### **Common options**

The following table contains common J9 v2.2 command line options.

-Xgcpolicy:optthruput	This command option sets no scavenger and no concurrent mark. This is the default.
-Xgcpolicy:optavgpause	This command option sets scavenger and concurrent mark.
-Xfuture	This command option enables the strictest checks, anticipating a future default.

Syntax	Description
-Xmca <x></x>	This command line option sets the RAM class segment increment to <x>.</x>
-Xmco <x></x>	This command line option sets the ROM class segment increment to <x>.</x>

-Xms <x></x>	This command line option sets the initial memory size to < <i>x&gt;</i> . <b>Note:</b> This option is the same as - <i>Xmo</i> < <i>x</i> >.
-Xmo <x></x>	This command line option sets the initial memory size to < <i>x&gt;</i> . <b>Note:</b> This option is the same as - <i>Xms</i> < <i>x</i> >.
-Xmoi <x></x>	This command line option sets the old space increment to <x>.</x>
-Xmx <x></x>	This command line option sets the object memory maximum to <x>.</x>
-Xmr <x></x>	This command line option sets the remembered set size to <x>.</x>
-Xmso <x></x>	This command line option sets the OS thread stack size to <x>.</x>
-Xiss <x></x>	This command line option sets the initial java thread stack size to $\langle x \rangle$ .
-Xss <x></x>	This command line option sets the maximum java thread to <x>.</x>

Syntax	Description
-Xdbg: <options></options>	This command line option enables standard Java Debug Wire Protocol (JDWP) debug options.
-Xrunjdwp: <options></options>	This command line option enables standard JDWP debug options. <b>Note:</b> Start a JDWP server. For more information on the JDWP options, see the <i>Connection and Invocation Details</i> web site.
-Xdbginfo: <symbol file="" path=""></symbol>	This command line option enables the debug info server.
-Xrdbginfo: <host>:<port></port></host>	This command line option enables the remote debug info server.

Syntax	Description
vmOption: -DLcduiHighResolution=true	This command line option enables high resolution mode. The MIDlet will be compatible on higher density displays(greater than 160 x 160 pixels)
vmOption: -XstdoutOnVFS.	This command line option sends debug information to the memory card. Any debug information reported by your MIDlet (i.e. standard out and standard error) will bestored on your device's SD card

The following table shows a detailed description of the deprecated commands:

-Xgc:verbose	Use the <i>-verbose:gc</i> option instead of this one.
