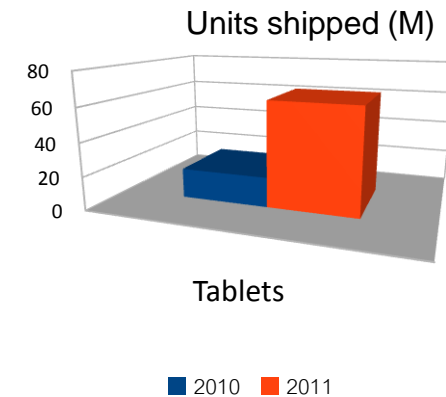


2011: Mobile devices surpass PC sales

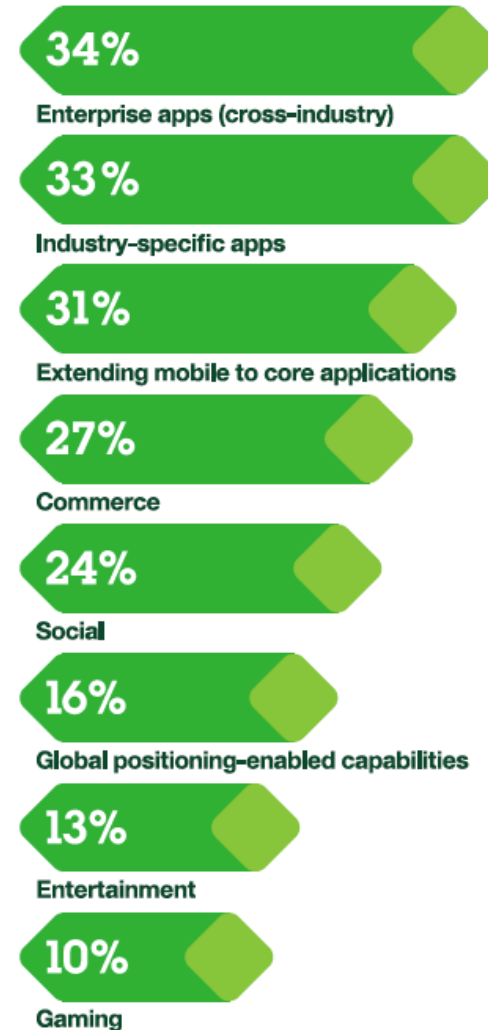
Mobile applications development & security “in demand”

Findings of the 2011 IBM Tech Trends Report

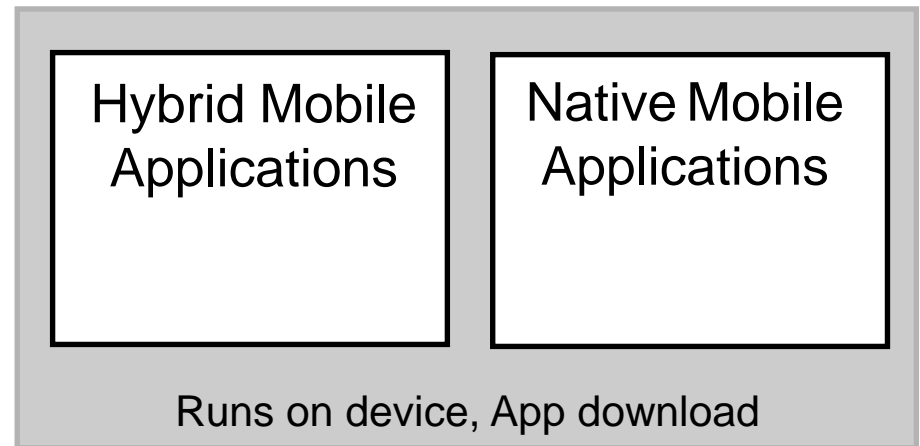
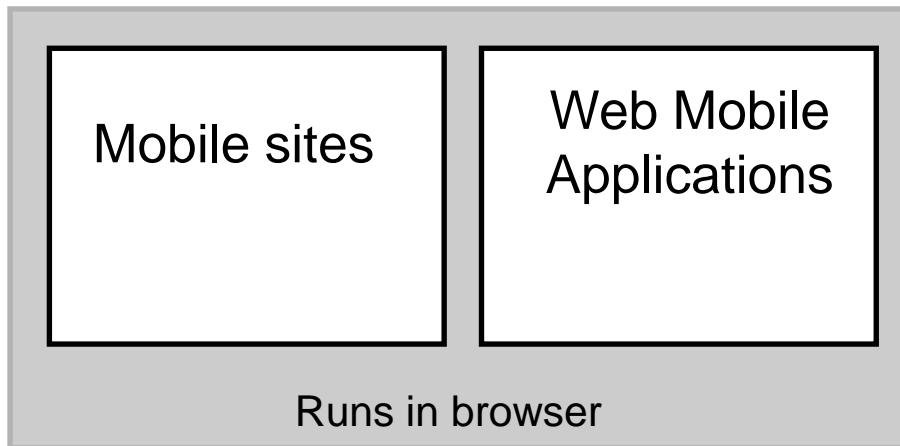
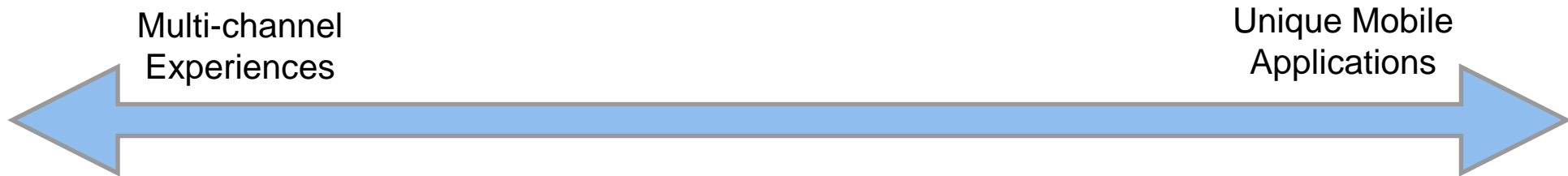


- Mobile is viewed by respondents as the second most “in demand” area for software development
