This guide is intended to get you started with downloading and using IBM Workload Deployer Image for x86 Systems.

Product overview

IBM® Workload Deployer Image for x86 Systems provides the operating environment in which virtual application patterns run, including the operating system and infrastructure unique to IBM Workload Deployer. Workload Deployer Image for x86 Systems is a prerequisite component for the use of virtual application patterns, such as IBM Web Application Pattern and IBM Database Patterns, with VMware ESX hypervisors. Web Application Pattern provides a set of components that are typical for online web applications, like Java Platform, Enterprise Edition (Java EE) applications, databases, Lightweight Directory Access Protocol (LDAP) servers, and messaging. Database Patterns consist of IBM Data Mart Pattern and IBM Transactional Database Pattern, which create and deploy databases in a Database-as-a-Service (DBaaS) cloud environment.

In addition to virtual application patterns, Workload Deployer Image for x86 Systems is also required for a set of shared services that are deployed by Workload Deployer in support of all patterns. These shared services include such components as web proxy and load balancing.


