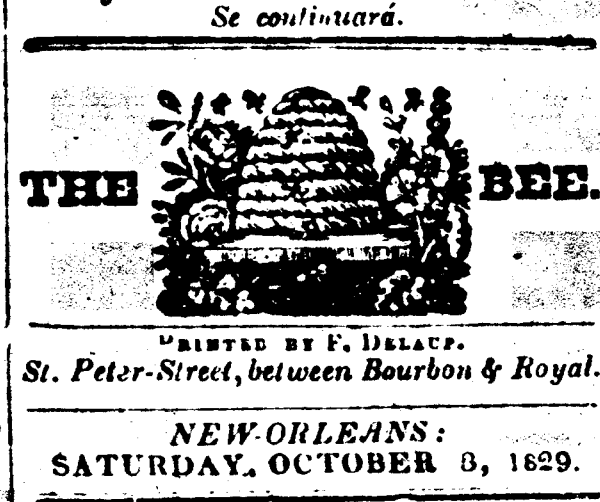

West India Trade.

The following facts we find in an Eastern paper with regard to the importance of this trade with only one of the islands. In five years from 1821 to 1826, the exports from the United States to the Island of Jamaica alone, amounted to two and a half millions of dollars.

In 1821, in consequence of the ports of this Island being closed against us, the exports from the United States were small, but during the three following years, there was a rapid increase of exports, and a corresponding decrease of exports from the British N. American Colonies.

In our commerce with the Island, it is further stated, we were in reality customers for its produce comparatively to a small extent. A large proportion of our imports were afterwards exported to Europe.
