Rocabu

A religious sect whose followers are believers in Jesus Christ and Buddha. The word Rocabu is synonymous for Roman Catholic and Buddhism. First coined by Jewish Scholar Richard Berke of Doylestown, Pennsylvania, the first known temple was established in Sarasota, Florida by Daniel S. Reilly. Reilly, being raised a Roman Catholic, was awe struck at the similarities of the two religions after reading "The Unknown Life of Jesus Christ" by Nicolas Notovitch. An encounter with Jehovah Witnesses in 2001, pressing for an explanation of Reilly's beliefs, brought Rocabu into the public arena. The first temple is known as the "Temple of Sugarloaf Drive" and is located in Nokomis.
