## The Burial of Jesus

As evening approached, there came a rich man <u>from Arimathea, named</u> Joseph, who had himself become a disciple of Jesus. <sup>58</sup>Going to Pilate, <u>he asked for Jesus' body, and Pilate</u> ordered that it be given to him. <sup>9</sup>Joseph took the body, wrapped it in a clean linen cloth. <sup>60</sup>and placed it in his own new tomb that he had cut out of the rock. He rolled a big stone in front of the entrance to the tomb and went away. <sup>61</sup>Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were sitting there opposite the tomb.

<sup>42</sup>It was Preparation Day (that is, the day before the Sabbath). So as evening approached, <sup>43</sup>Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent member of the Council, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for Iesus' body. 44Pilate was surprised to hear that he was already dead. Summoning the centurion, he asked him if Jesus had already died. <sup>45</sup>When he learned from the centurion that it was so, he gave the <u>body to Joseph. <sup>46</sup>So Joseph bought</u> some linen cloth, took down the <u>body, wrapped it in the linen, and</u> placed it in a tomb cut out of rock. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. <sup>39</sup>He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventyfive pounds. [a] 40 Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. 41 At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. \*Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.
