GOOD COLD SLAW.

Shave the cabbage fine, throwing into hot water as fast as shredded. Allow it to stand about two hours to crisp. Then season to taste with salt, pepper and a few drops of mustard. For a dressing beat the yolks of two eggs with two tablespoons of melted butter and beat again. Add a half teaspoonful of thick sour cream, two teaspoonsful of sugar and half a cupful of vinegar. Beat them three or four minutes, pour on the cabbage and mix.—N. Y. Herald.

FRENCH WINE.

Rub together through a sieve three tablespoons of mustard and one of granulated sugar, beat an egg slightly and work into the mustard and sugar until smooth, then work in slowly half a pint of vinegar, tarragon gives a finer flavor than common elder vinegar. Stir and cook over hot water. Remove from the fire and when cool beat in a tablespoonful of olive oil.—Washington Star.
