...the removal of the Red River Raft, which
will be made at the War Department
on the first day of April next, for removal and
destruction in Red River, known as the Red River
Raft, which will consist of all trees and river open
to the river channel by raft for a distance of two
years more, as follows, viz:
Each bidder will propose to remove the said raft
and have the navigation free from obstruction
for a period of two years, for a sum of \$160,000
payable by his bid, the time specified, which he proposes
to employ for the removal; (the said time not to be
earlier than the first day of January, 1855,) as also the

The Board of Education has decided to increase the amount of money available for the education of immigrants by \$1,000,000. This will be used for the construction of new schools, including the building of dormitory buildings, and the enlargement of existing schools. The Board of Education, which is responsible for the administration of the schools, has been given the power to hire additional teachers, including Latin, French, and German, as well as other subjects. The Board of Education also plans to increase the number of students in the higher mathematics; Mr. Macmillan, who is the head of the Spanish and adjacent Professions, and Mr. de Tournaire, as Professor of Latin and French.
