




about 2 billion mobile web subscribers in 2015

mobile web will overtake desktop web in 2014



2G will dominate in the global south (2014)



3G or 3rd generation is standard for networks for mobile phone and other telecommunication devices that provide peak data rates of 200kb/s.

2G or 2nd generation networks were built mainly for voice and slow data transmission. GPRS which is commonly used for data transmission on 2G networks has speeds ranging from 56-115 kb/s.




3G devices are extremely expensive in Global South & 3G penetration is inversely correlated to device cost









tech implications

- Need a base platform that is well integrated into the core platform
- Need to hire engineers and product research on specific segments
- Do some usability testing, especially for smart phones
- Reading features are easier to implement
- Additional features are needed, but needs more research
 - Possible contributions: spelling changes, upload images, short line edits, posting to discussion pages, rate articles
 - Categorization of articles, tag images, work us through our queue



next steps

- Integrate our mobile gateway into the core infrastructure
- Assessment of lightweight gateway, determine & execute solution
- Expand readership and contributions
 - Internal development tools & platforms
 - Strategic partnerships marketing, co-development and partner support
 - Community mobile crowdsourcing, developer networks
