Assessment - Overview

Book chapter

Author a free, online, book chapter about a specific motivation and/or emotion topic.

- Learning outcome: Integrate theory and research to explain a specific topic
- Communication: Written communication of in an open, online environment. Online and face-to-face communication with staff and students to get feedback.
- Working independently & with others: Working independently & in collaboration via an open wiki platform.
- Social responsibility: Developing an educational resource which is publically available under an open license.

Book chapter topics

- Table of contents: Draft topics are available – you can edit or suggest more
- Lecture 2 and Tutorial 1: Discuss/expand the table of contents
- Sign up or negotiate topic: You can propose or sign up to a chapter topic any time by emailing the convener (with your Wikiversity and real name). You should have a topic by the end of W3.

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Book chapter topics: Tips

Make sure the topic and content:

- Clearly relates to either motivation or emotion (and will allow you to draw on available psychological theory and research)
- Clearly relates to the book's best-seller target audience and central theme – the book chapters use psychological science to help explain how people can self-help to lead happier, more motivated lives



- 3. Webcam/video camera (optional).



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

- 6. Add links


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Quizzes
